Tysoe forms part of a 53 Village / Hamlet portfolio for the team and we are focused on community engagement, crime prevention and problem solving. The team are involved in safeguarding as well as working with partner agencies.

It is advised that matters involving crime are still reported via the 101 or online facility and the team will pick up investigations and link in with the officers investigating.

## Crime Overview.

The information relating to crimes reported within the Tysoe area have been taken from January 2024 to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2024. The area itself is not classed as a hotspot for crime and has low figures compared to other areas.

Between the dates detailed there have been no reported residential burglaries and no reported business burglaries.

There have been two theft offences reported with one being a refuse bin!

There have been four anti-social behaviour incidents reported over the period but not specifically linked to each other.

Over the period detailed there were 14 calls for service which include reports of concern, road related and suspicious circumstances.

We are also looking into exploring Community Speed Watch initiatives but will be looking for 'safe sites' in which to conduct the checks.
