

TRIBUTE TO THE QUEEN

Uppermost in many people's minds on their twenty first birthdays is where to get totalled most quickly/cheaply. Not so Her Majesty! She used the day, whilst on a royal tour to South Africa in 1947 to make the following speech. Ironically she was taken on the tour to try and separate her from the young man, later to become her consort for almost 75 years. Many of those at Court did not approve of Philip Mountbatten!



"I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family, to which we all belong". Thus she set the stage for the next three quarters of a century. Her work ethic has never failed to amaze. It was only her mobility issues that forced her to step back recently. The oath she took at her Coronation was not taken lightly. For the next 75 years selfless duty and service to others would become her watchword.

As the longest serving Head of State in the world she is universally respected, revered and to many holds an almost God-like position. Many are the countries that would love her as a head of State. But, she is our Queen and although we guard her jealously we are prepared to share her with others. Recently the German equivalent of the Oxford English Dictionary added a new word 'Die Queen'. This was done despite already having a perfectly good word for queen (koenigin). Predictably there is no plural form!

Her influence on many of us, which is largely immeasurable, is best summed up by Enoch Powell "Our monarch is not a crowned President. She is anointed. She represents a super-natural element in the nation.

Long may she reign.

DOWN MEMORY LANE....

Silver Jubilee Bank Holiday Tuesday 7th June 1977 dawned cold and wet but the initial inclemency of the weather did not dampen or deter the enthusiasm to celebrate the 25th Anniversary of the accession to the throne of Queen Elizabeth II. This day was particularly, although not entirely, devoted to providing the young people with a day to remember.



The first event at 12.15pm in the school playground was the crowning of the Jubilee Queen Miss Yvonne Hirons by Dr K Greenway. Miss Hirons was



attended by Miss Carol Butcher. In the meantime the school yard was rapidly filling with children who were competitors in the

decorated bicycle and home made crowns competitions. The judges Mr & Mrs T Trought had the unenviable task of selecting the winners.

Following these competitions procession, the carnival consisting of three decorated lorries, one decorated mini van and a magnificent crown propelled by members of the playgroup all accompanied decorated bv bicycles, moved through the village which had been decorated with bunting for the occasion. The procession went to Poolgate and then back to the Sports Field.

From 3pm onwards sports were held in the sports field for the young (and not so young). Notable among the events was a pram race with the prams filled with some peculiar babies most propelled by some equally apparitions of strange mothers. The morning and afternoon proceedings culminated in the presents of Jubilee Mugs to all Tysoe children under 14 years by My Tom Gardner, Chairman of Tysoe Utilities Estate Trust which had donated the mugs.

PUDDING PARTY REPORT

#TysoeSupportsUkraine

Before the Russian invasion, I'd never given much thought to what happens to animals during a time of conflict. But due to the press, and social media sites, we're now able to see all the distressing images of war and that includes pictures and stories of defenceless animals hurt or lost.



Beloved pets now roam the streets, some with wounds or burns, all looking for food and safety. Animals left in zoos, sanctuaries and shelters with limited supplies. Horses abandoned, left to fend for themselves.

It was whilst following the Ukraine Animal Rescue Information Face-book page, that I realised I wanted to try and help in some way. I tried to think of an event that would be fun for children and that's when the idea for a Pudding Party came to life.

The £1,202 raised by the children back in April was split amongst the following groups:


War Paws Ltd
Breaking The Chains
IFAW (International Fund for Animal Welfare)

This amount may seem like a drop in the ocean with regards to the needs of the animals that are suffering and who will continue to suffer for the foreseeable future, but do we know that EVERY penny counts. EVERY donation helps.

There are so many charities and rescue groups in Ukraine still desperate for funds to help pay for food, vehicles, fuel, vets bills etc, along with supplies to build the hundreds of shelters that are needed. We are told it is going to be a long war - Let's not give up on them now. Anyone fancy a party?

War Paws Limited's aim is to alleviate the pain and suffering of animals in hostile environments and areas of civil conflict. Working behind the scenes, they have partnered with Breaking the Chains and other organisations in Ukraine to help rehome and provide food and shelter to the animals that the groups are bringing out of the country. www.warpaws.org

Breaking the Chains is an organisation run by Tom, an ex-military animal lover. Tom decided to mobilise a team to head into the red zones within Ukraine to both rescue animals and bring aid to those who most need it. So far, they have raised £70,727 of the £90,000 target through a JustGiving page. These funds are essential to help as many animals in Ukraine as possible.



IFAW (International Fund for Animal Welfare) is a global organisation. committed to helping the people and animals impacted by the crisis in Ukraine for as long as necessary. Working with partners in Ukraine to care for animals in shelters. zoos and sanctuaries and helping refugees in Poland coming across the border with their pets by delivering pet food and veterinary supplies.

YOU'VE GOT TO LOVE A BUG!



May and June are great months to reflect on the importance of 'bugs' (AKA invertebrates). To quote David Attenborough (who's just a couple of weeks younger than the Queen) 'If we and the rest of the backboned animals were to disappear overnight, the rest of the world would get on pretty well. But if they (invertebrates) were to disappear, the land's ecosystems would collapse. The soil would lose its fertility. Many of the plants would no longer be pollinated. Lots of animals, amphibians, reptiles, birds, mammals would have nothing to eat. And our fields and pastures would be covered with dung and carrion'.

Living in a rural community we've plenty of opportunity to support bugs and, whilst some bugs may be ugly, they all have a role in the ecosystem. At the moment the Parish is home to many hundreds of baby birds and a good proportion of them, and their parents, will depend on 'bugs' as a source of food. Birds time their breeding to exploit the availability of food: earthworms in the case of blackbirds and song thrushes, and caterpillars in the case of tits and chaffinches. Similarly, migrant species such as house martins and swallows time their arrival to coincide with an increase in the numbers of flying insects. Green woodpeckers love ants!

Most insects prefer native plants to complete their lifecycles and trees such as willow, oak and birch support lots of caterpillar species. Both wild and cultivated flowers will attract nectar-feeding insects. A little untidiness helps: log-piles, decaying leaves, and longer grass (such as the verges during 'No Mow May') are all good habitats for bugs, and where there are more invertebrates, there should be more birds, bats and amphibians such as frogs and toads.

TYSOE VILLAGE HALL UPDATE

As many of you will know, the village hall is currently closed and I'm very sorry to have to report that it will remain so, probably, to the end of September.

Our insurers' appointed loss adjusters – Crawford & Company - have handled the claim disastrously, failing to respond to, or heed, our advice and warnings since May 2021 and, only this week realised the seriousness of the claim when they received an initial estimate of over £100,000. Separately, I had also issued a formal complaint to the Financial Ombudsman Service and we await the outcome of this.

We met Crawford's "Major & Complex Loss" representatives on Friday and, for the first time, are hopeful that they are now getting a grip on the situation. Unbelievably, Crawford's contractors ripped up the floor before realising structural damage beneath and abandoned work 4 weeks ago, leaving the hall in a dangerous state and un-usable.

For those wishing to access the hall for any items, this is obviously still possible, but please contact a committee member, as you'll need to be accompanied and shown the risk hazards.

We can only apologise for this situation, which is not of our making and out of our hands.

The visas for Nadiia, Vira and Yeva (who Fred Price met on the Polish border at the Ukrainian consulate - pictured right) have come through, and they were seeking air tickets to travel to Yeovil to stay with their hosts, Anna and Michel and family.

Ranit Katz posted on Facebook that: "Olya, a 21 year-old refugee, is joining their family. Please say hello if you see us about."



The visa process is in train for other individuals to come to the area. The visa application form is now in Ukrainian which makes things easier for those applying to come to the UK.

There are offers of accommodation in the area but with no matched refugees which needs addressing. Numbers arriving in the UK could increase - it is simply not possible to tell what will happen in the months ahead, but we need to be prepared.

Preparing for the arrival of refugees

We need to consider:

- Practicalities like transport, a social hub, provision of laptops, assistance with basic administration and funds for basics such as food, clothing, etc.
- Extending a warm welcome and showing a smiling face, as well as offering practical help.
- Donating through future fundraising i.e. at the village cricket match - likely to be on 21st August. Also, a pop-up brunch between now and then with a bucket donation.




